Q: What type of testing should I use?

A: That decision should be made by first determining what you want to detect and why. Urine should be used if you want to detect drugs of abuse recently used. Hair tests could be used if you want to broaden the detection period. Detection periods vary by drug. All of our tests can be ordered by individuals, companies, or even by the court.

Q: What is adulteration or adulterants?

A: Adulteration is the tampering of a specimen in an attempt to pass a drug test. There are several adulteration products that are either ingested or added to the specimen. We

offer test strips that detect several different parameters of adulteration.

Q: Do you offer Random Drug Testing?

"POINT OF LAW"

Have you ever had a case that had multiple defenses and were shocked when you won on the first defense? Earlier this month, ATI was present for testimony on a DUI case where a retest had been performed on the states evidence. On cross-examination of the arresting officer,

the criminal defense attorney was able to prove that the urine sample the state collected was not only for reasons of alcohol testing but also for purposes of drug testing for possible use of controlled substances. The officer testified that his jail's policy is to request a blood or urine test when the defendant mentions they are on medication. This was the case here. However, it was discovered on the recorded tape of the reading of the IC Advisory, that the officer did not read the section on controlled substances as required by statute. The case was rescinded and a lengthy hearing on the science of the
